Computers Assisting People Inc. is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization made up of technically skilled volunteers who bring the empowerment of computers and technology to Cleveland non-profits.

Mission Statement

The information technology age has divided the world into two separate classes – the technology "haves" and "have-nots". Information is power and computer technology is the means to acquiring that information and hence, that power. Employment opportunities and even everyday life are becoming increasingly dependent on computer technology. The mission of CAP Inc. is to reach those elements of society that may not have the opportunity to benefit from the technology that many of us take for granted.
